REBUILDING

Months after a devastating earthquake shook New Zealand's Canterbury region on September 4, rebuilding and rejuvenation are being celebrated. The owners of heritage-listed Otahuna Lodge have lovingly restored the 115-year-old manor house after it sustained significant damage. In keeping with a tradition running since the Lodge's construction in 1895, the tradesmen working on the reconstruction signed their names on the walls of the Lodge's attic. The quake also dug up some of the property's history with the discovery of pages from an 1889 almanac found, as well as a tin of tobacco hidden next to an antique bottle of 'lung preserver'. otahuna.co.nz
